Dr. Margo Brooks Carthon receives prestigious Claire Fagin Award

Margo Brooks Carthon, PhD, RN, FAAN, is the recipient of the 18th Claire M. Fagin Distinguished Researcher Award in honor of Dr. Claire M. Fagin. Dr. Brooks Carthon is an acclaimed nurse scientist and is recognized both nationally and internationally for significant contributions in promoting greater awareness of policies and practices that support and advance equity and inclusivity. Dr. Brooks Carthon's innovative research includes the THRIVE model, which reduces disparities and supports transitions for low-income individuals with multiple chronic conditions. The THRIVE model was designated as an Edge Runner by the American Academy of Nursing in 2024. Dr. Brooks Carthon has received numerous awards, including the Teresa E. Christy Award for Exemplary Historical Research and Writing, the Academy Health's Learning Health System Challenge, and the Interdisciplinary Research Group on Nursing Issues (IRGNI) Mentorship Award.

Dr. Julie Fairman elected to American Philosophical Society

Julie A. Fairman, PhD, RN, FAAN, was elected to The American Philosophical Society (APS), the nation's oldest and most distinguished learned society. The APS was founded in 1743 by Benjamin Franklin to bring together creative thinkers in the sciences and other fields of study for the broad purpose of "promoting useful knowledge" and comprises a distinguished legacy including George Washington, John Adams, Thomas Jefferson, Albert Einstein, Robert Frost, and Sandra Day O'Connor, among many others. Dr. Fairman's distinguished contributions include innovative approaches such as the conceptualization of nursing as a key analytical category for understanding the history of health care and health policy post-World War II and leading a student-led seminar in which students use primary documents to explore the history of American health care. Dr. Fairman was the first nurse invited to deliver the Garrison Lecture at the American Association for the History of Medicine.
